Where not to buy pesticides?



- at a stall
- from a car
- from unknown, foreign traders
- from a friend
- from under the counter

You breach the law when...

- you import pesticides without the licence of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development

Beware!

You may be subject to criminal liability and administrative consequences!



Where and how to buy pesticides?

From retail and wholesale stores, or distributors that:

- are registered with the State Inspectorate of Plant Health and Seed Inspection (PIORiN)
- only sell plant protection products registered in Poland
- can provide a proof of purchase, i.e. a receipt or an invoice.



Your purchase is legal...

...when you buy products registered for sale in legal distribution points supervised by the Polish Inspectorate of Plant Health and Seed Inspection (PIORiN)



You can lose your EU subsidies

You can lose your EU subsidies. The use of non-registered, including counterfeit, plant protection products, constitutes an infringement of the cross-compliance principles.

Loss of financial help from the EU



You can lose the crops

Counterfeit plant protection products can show no effect at all or destroy your crops. Many farmers have already experienced that.

If you buy registered plant protection products and use them in accordance with the product label and the Good Agricultural Practice (GAP) guidelines, you can be sure that your crops will be safe. Your customers will be satisfied with the quality of your produce.
